
	Market Commentary
Oil prices rose today starting the week out strong after having a negative week last week. The biggest yet unsurprising news was the Chesapeake bankruptcy. The "fracking trailblazer" that was once the second largest US gas producer was finally overcome by its debt laden balance sheet. Of course Natural Gas prices are also at multi-year lows. In giving credit where credit is due, Chesapeake did contribute in large part to the rebirth of American fossil fuel and set the stage for the US to be the world's largest producer. They failed to realize however that they should also have been tapping shale reserves for oil, which turned out to be much more profitable since the 90s. The result was an over extended company fruitlessly selling assets in an attempt to pay down its debt. BP also announced they will be divesting the remainder of their petrochemical business to INEOS.
